MESSAGE FROM THE COMMISSION

The Commission met for the first time following the pandemic on Saturday 11th March 2023. That is exactly two years since the meeting on the Saturday before the lockdown. We have not been completely idle in all that time as we have been busy reviewing the handbook to ensure that it reflected the current training and practice and is easier to find the text on any particular topic. The printed version of this book should be available in September this year ready for the Formation courses.

Two Formation courses were run in 2022 with the Bishop Commissioning 41 Ministers on 19th November 2022. Formation courses and commissioning have been booked for this year (see below).

Due to predicted bad weather conditions this meeting was held on line for the first time ever. Whilst we all missed the personal contact of an in person meeting, the meeting was very successful and we appreciated not having to travel long distances across the diocese to attend. As a result we have agreed to hold the July meeting on line.

During the meeting Canon Don Bowdren retired as Chair of the Commission and handed over to Canon Philip Ziomek. Fr Philip Thanked Canon Don for his years of service.

There are vacancies on the Commissions not least the position of Secretary and county representatives who serve for a period of four years. Here is a summary of the duties required for these positions: -

<u>Secretary</u>

In conjunction with the Chair: -

- Book Commission Meetings. Normally March, June and November each year.
- Arrange Agenda and circulate to Commission Members.
- Take Minutes of Commission meetings and circulate minutes to Commission members and the Bishop.
- Provide details for the Diocesan Year Book.
- Assist the Chair with any reports required by the Diocese.
- Annual report of the Commission for the Newsletter.
- Point of contact for general correspondence and queries.

County Representatives

- Maintain an up-to-date list "Active" and "No longer Active" Ministers within their County and Deanery Groups.
- Advise the Director of Aftercare of any changes in status of a commissioned minister to enable the central records to be kept up to date especially the Book of Remembrance.
- Arrange Diocesan Renewal Days. Every fourth year each county in turn should invite the Bishop to lead the Day and be the main speaker.
- Arrange County Renewal Days.
- Maintain a list of Parish Contacts and initiate the replacement of Parish Contacts when needed.
- Ensure that Parish Priests are kept fully informed normally via the Parish Contacts.
- Inform the Editor of the Book of Remembrance of additional names for inclusion, send a memorial

card and endeavour to ensure that the Commission is represented at the funeral.

• Budget for their County activities.

Your county will inform you of these when they send out the invites for the Renewal Days. We look forward to welcoming some new members following the Renewal Days. None of these positions requires full time involvement and generally only require input of a few days/ hours a year.

CANON PHILIPP ZIOMEK : COMMISSION CHAIRMAN.

Dear Friends,

You and I are at the forefront of the Great Commission of the Lord that will be echoed again at the Solemnity of the Ascension; "Go out and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and know that I am with you always. Yes, even to the end of time.

So often we are caught up in the web and weave of time and space, that the necessary stillness exampled by the Lord can be lost in the cares of the immediate in our lives. Be encouraged to find just that little bit of space each day; that necessary moment of prayerful engagement to listen to the voice of the Father, that like the Lord, we too as Ministers of the Great Commission find, "my food is to do the will of my Father in Heaven". Then we shall live up to our baptismal calling, so recently renewed at the mother of All Vigils; that of Easter itself.

The proclamation of the Apostles after the Resurrection surely is found in the words, "we ate and drank with Him after His resurrection". Isn't that what Mother Church invites of all of her children in life's journey? Isn't that what we do every time we come to the Divine Eucharist? So, we are caught up in the Eternal Present in the great miracle of the Eucharistic Sacrifice. A moment when time itself is stilled, and the beloved children of God are immediate and one with the Father, fulfilling the prayer of Jesus Himself at the first celebration of the miracle of changing bread and wine into the Body & Blood of the Saviour, that we become participant in the eternal day of the Resurrection. Thus, every time we celebrate the Mass, time stands still, and we caught up in the mystery of Redemption; we eat and drink with Him after His resurrection in the same way that the first Apostles did. Enriched with such an encounter, surely, we can understand the urgency of the Lord, when addressing Mary of Magdalene; "Do not cling to me but go! Tell the brothers, I go before them into Galilee". Our task is to assist others to know the Galilee of their lives. To go into that future knowing that the Lord has walked before us and continues to lead us to The Father.

Easter is that wonderful time when Heaven and earth are united. Your ministry brings that wonderful union every time you raise the Sacred Host and utter those beautiful words: "The Body of Christ". It is then dear friends, that we all eat and drink with Him after His resurrection, proclaiming His redeeming death, until the moment of His return to take us with Him. Have a happy Eastertide these next forty days.

It only remains for me to thank so many who over the last thirty plus years have established this tremendous ministry in the Diocese of Nottingham through our Commission, and to pray the Lord's blessing upon all of you who so joyfully work so hard with Him, to the Father's Glory. May the Holy Spirit be our inspiration, guide and counsellor as we grow deeper in the mystery of the Divine Love shown to us in Jesus Christ. Bless you all.

PS Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion were commissioned in this Diocese from 1978 and Canon Philip joined the EM Commission in 1997 as its Vice Chair.

FORMATION

In 2022 we were aware of the need for some new ministers but not the level of demand. Initially we planned on holding one Formation Weekend but in the end there were sufficient applicants for two, so a second was arranged.

The first weekend was held at Holy Trinity Newark on 8th-9th October followed a week later by the weekend at the Rosmini Centre, Radcliffe. The Commissioning was at the Cathedral on 17th November when Bishop Patrick commissioned 41 new Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion.

Two Formation courses have been booked for 2023: -

- 2nd-3rd September at Newark
- 9-10th September at Rosmini Centre, Ratcliffe.

Application forms were distributed to the Clergy earlier in April. Applications open until August.

Commissioning will be by the Bishop on November 18th at the Cathedral.

If we get a HUGE number of applications we have some contingency for an additional weekend.
