On the name for our area of "ENGLISH MARTYRS and ST GEORGE'S", this is in line with the simplification of parish titles eg St Mary's, Allestree, Mackworth is now "Ralph Sherwin".

#### GOSPEL REFLECTION

Jesus' focuses his high priestly prayer on us, his disciples and we do well to note its emphasis. True, some of these passages seem abstract and inaccessible but if we take time to mediate on them, slowly reading and re-reading them and allowing the words to penetrate like soft rain on the sometimes hardened 'soil' of our hearts, we begin, little by little, to be drawn into the Paschal Mystery of Christ's life, death and resurrection. In doing this we experience Jesus as the Vine and we as the Branches – staying in union with God so that we receive his love and peace. We live out our faith in the world. Satan is the Prince of this World, and Jesus prays that we be protected.

Indeed, we pray for this protection every time we say the *Our Father* 'Deliver us from evil' isn't just a theory: it's a real prayer against a real enemy. The goal of the Christian life is to be holy. To be sanctified. To be set apart. Perhaps as Leon Bloy said, 'The only real tragedy in life is not to be a saint'. True, not many of us will be declared venerable, blessed or canonised but that doesn't prevent us from being holy and being saints.

How are we sanctified and made holy? Through God's grace and by opening ourselves up to receive this blessing. Through reading the Scriptures, prayer and receiving the Eucharist we build a foundation for holiness and learn to walk the royal road. This call to holiness is lived out (for most of us) in the heat of the day, the banality of everyday living, the cut and thrust of everyday life. This kind of holiness isn't reserved for the few, it is our calling, to put into practice the Sermon on the Mount, to witness to the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit.

'Soul of Christ, sanctify me. Body of Christ, save me. Blood of Christ inebriate me. Water from the side of Christ, wash me. Passion of Christ strengthen me. O good Jesus, hear me. Within your wounds hide me. Permit me not to be separated from you. (Anima Christi)
