HOLY SPIRIT CHURCH: The final Sunday Mass will be celebrated today, Easter Sunday, as decreed by Bishop Patrick a year ago when he asked Fr Alan to continue Mass for one more year following his retirement. Sadly, that day has arrived.

GOSPEL REFLECTION:

The central truth of Christian faith, the resurrection of Jesus, is embedded in the soil of human history. Testified to as a real event, historically verified in the New Testament, Jesus' resurrection is the crowning truth of faith. It is the central plank, the cornerstone, the very foundation of the living tradition of faith handed down to us from the apostles, as these words from Paul make clear:

'I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures and that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas then in the Twelve' (1 Cor. 15:3-4).

John holds out to us the empty tomb as the sign of the resurrection. However, and for sure, an empty tomb in and of itself is not direct proof that Jesus rose from the dead – the absence of the body could be otherwise explained. The empty tomb is a sign inviting us to enter into the mystery of the risen Lord. John leads us into this mystery of faith by recording his own reaction on entering the tomb; when he discovered the linen cloths lying there, he saw and believed. (v.9)

What are we to conclude from this eyewitness account? On entering the tomb John realised immediately that Jesus had risen, and we too are invited to believe, based on the witness of the apostles. He doesn't say what made him know instinctively that the absence of Jesus' body could not have been by human doing or even that Jesus had not simply returned to earthly life (resuscitated and not resurrected, so to speak).

Jesus' resurrection testifies to the promise of a new humanity, a new creation, radiating and resplendent with the glory, power and beauty of God. The basis of Easter rejoicing and happiness is that through the grace of our baptism we are immersed into Jesus' death and resurrection and become partakers in his divine life, the life of the resurrection.

Jesus Christ is risen today! Alleluia! Alleluia! He has turned all our sunsets into dawns. He has conquered death: death has been vanquished, its sting removed. He is the Alpha and Omega, the Beginning and the End. He is the Lord of Life and he will live forever.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION: Classes will begin on Sunday, 4th May. Fr Mark Brentnall will address parents and children after the Sunday Masses during May. Forms for application will be available at church. Candidates are children of Year 3 school age or older children who have not yet made their First Holy Communion.

POPE FRANCIS: It was good to see Pope Francis in his wheelchair among people on Palm Sunday. We thank God for his recovery from serious illness and pray that he will be well enough to continue his work as leader of the Church. May God bless him with good health for the future.

Lord, help me to believe that you died and rose for me.
