GOSPEL REFLECTION - Matthew 3:1-12

On the eve of the third millennium Pope John Paul II said, 'The Council, while not imitating the sternness of John the Baptist who called for repentance and conversation on the banks of the Jordan (cf. Luke 3:1-7), did show something of the Prophet of old, pointing out with fresh vigour to the men and women of today that Jesus Christ is the "Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29), the Redeemer of humanity and the Lord of history' (*Tertio millennio adveniente* 19).

Poor John the Baptist's message is often construed as harsh, and yet the Gospel cannot be proclaimed without something of this great prophet of old; the invitation to return to God and the proclamation that Jesus is the Lamb who takes away the sin of the world. John lived and preached in the wilderness, dressed in rough clothing woven from camel hair, and ate locusts and wild honey and yet the people still flocked to him.

We seem to have moved away from sin, repentance, confession and conversion: perhaps this isn't 'on message' anymore. But we can still acknowledge that examination of our lives, confession and repentance are crucial to living the Christian life, then as now.

Advent is a penitential season, a time to be reconciled with God and one another. We're invited to make a sacramental confession at least once a year, but many of us haven't been for years. God's hand of mercy and compassion is extended to everyone. Remember, we're not confessing our sins to the priest but rather laying down our burden before God. If a priest has received faculties to hear confession (and this isn't automatically granted by the bishop) we hope and pray that he has the necessary pastoral wisdom and maturity to minister this sacred grace so that we can know in a deeply personal way the mercy, forgiveness and compassion of God.

"Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love.... Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity. Cleanse me from my sin." (Ps. 51:1-2)

.THE FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION Thursday, 8th December - Luke 1:26-38

The most profound questions of life are: is there a God, and does God care? God's resounding response is 'Yes', which broke forth in the Annunciation. The Virgin's name was Mary, a daughter of Zion. She was a young Jewess, very likely just a teenager, growing up in the small, remote village of Nazareth. The angel came to her, assured her of God's grace and favour, and presented her with God's new plan of salvation. By the power of the Holy Spirit the child to be born of her flesh was to become the Son of God. God was coming to save his people by becoming flesh, by becoming

'How can this be?' Mary implored. Her perplexity was a genuinely human reaction. God would do this if she trusted and believed. What was she to do? The early Fathers of the Church view this moment as a time of hushed silence and hopeful anticipation in heaven. Could the prison of disobedience be broken open by Mary's obedient surrender and trust? All creation waited with bated breath. Mary offered herself as the handmaid of the Lord and allowed God's deepest desire to be made flesh in her. The holiness of God met human fragility and in the person of her Son we are forever bonded by grace of God.

In the thirteenth century Duns Scotus, a Franciscan friar in Oxford, expressed the mystery of Mary's immaculate beginning. 'She was redeemed by way of being preserved from sin. Mary remains highly favoured, yet stands in unity with each human person needing the saving work of her son. She is a model of what is means to be a Christian. When we find it hard to trust God, Mary shows the way forward — obedience to him brings new, divine life to ourselves and others'

Let us listen to the Word of God, actively seek out his plan and fan our desire to let him live in us and transform us. If we are faithful the world will know that God still loves his people.

Blessed Mary, I love you as you are the one who trusted the Word of God and yielded your whole person to the plan of our eternal Father.

There will be our usual 9.30 am Mass at St George's, plus Mass at 7 pm at Holy Spirit in celebration of this lovely feast day of Our Blessed Lady. Also, after the 9.30 am Mass at St George's and also after the 7 pm Mass at Holy Spirit, there will be opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession).
