Fr PETER SHARES HIS THOUGHTS FOR LENT

Septuagesima, Sexagesima, Quinquagesima – older people will remember the names given to the Sundays before Lent which was known as Quadragesima (the forty days). They were removed when the Church Calendar was



simplified, after the Second Vatican Council. I used to sing with my Catechism children:

"Those three Sundays before Lent, Will prepare us to repent, That in Lent we may begin, Earnestly to mourn for sin." We should now be drawing our attention to the fact that Lent is coming (it begins on February 17th), so we can put a bit more thought into how we will observe the holy season. Have you not often realised, on Shrove Tuesday evening, "Oh dear, what am I going to do for Lent this year? - I'd better give up chocolate (or whatever) as I usually do"? If we begin our preparation two weeks earlier, we can be more constructive -What do I want to achieve this Lent? To deepen my faith? To spend more time with my Bible? To get to know Jesus better? To walk more closely with Him day by day? As, Christians we have found prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to be an important part of repentance and renewal. Many Catholics now add something during Lent rather than giving up something, either to address personal habits that need work or to add some outreach to others in need. Is there some habitual fault I want to conquer? Can I give an act of love maybe a donation to a charity or appeal? We should always be ready, this Lent is our great opportunity to be so. Fr Peter
