Gospel Reading: John 12: 20-33



In John's Gospel this 5th Sunday of Lent, we are presented with a "hero" in a way which is dramatically different from what convention suggests. We begin to see Jesus at his most human, he is just like us in that he shares in the struggles of life by facing his own human struggle.

He tells us "now my soul is troubled". These are certainly not the words we expect to hear from a leader, from a hero. The things we can learn from the Gospel this weekend: we should not be afraid to live through the ups and down of our own lives; it is ok to admit that we are struggling when we are and our lowest points can become the turning points we need.
