ASH WEDNESDAY

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. But why are we ashed in church on Ash Wednesday? Ashes make us appreciate our mortality. Since the Fall we are reminded that 'you are dust and to dust you shall return' (Gen 3:19). Ashes are associated with repentance as Job 'repents in dust and ashes' (Job 42:6) when the

people of God were entering into an intense time of prayer in the Book of Maccabees 'they fasted that day, put on sackcloth and sprinkled ashes on their heads and tore their clothes' (1 Maccabees 3:47). The Biblical custom of ashing as a symbol of entering a time of prayer and fasting recognises that we are human beings with physical bodies. Ash Wednesday with its ashing, prayer and fasting physically unites us to what we strive to do spiritually throughout Lent

Ash Wednesday is where we begin our annual journey through the wilderness as the holy season of Lent. Lent offers us all an opportunity to grow in our relationship with God and to deepen our commitment to a way of life, the way of intentional discipleship, which began with our baptism. In our busy world, Lent provides us with an opportunity to reflect upon our patterns, to pray more deeply, experience sorrow for what we've done and failed to do, and to be generous to those in need.

The Lenten works of prayer, fasting and almsgiving strengthen our resolve for discipleship and help left the veil of selfishness from our eyes. (Intentional) Discipleship is the call of all the baptised. We are called to grow in holiness and bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to others through our daily lives. We can only truly do this by encountering our God who waits for us in the wilderness of our Lenten journey. The words of Ash Wednesday "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return" remind us that one day we will be called to give an account for discipleship. The cross the ashes make show that we are marked and chosen, each one by name. Our parish almsgiving in the form of the Lenten Alms will again be dedicated to continue the work of Mary's Meals and the Derby Deanery Refugee Settlement Project.
