The readings for this third Sunday in Lent:

We continue our Lenten journey and join Jesus this week as he goes up to Jerusalem. Our readings offer us the wisdom of God's law in the commandments, and Jesus's forceful action regarding the true meaning of God's Temple. The ten commandments in the First Reading from Exodus present the Law as a freedom charter – we have been freed from slavery to serve our God. The Psalm 18 is a joyful poem of praise for God's precepts. It links the teaching of the commandments to their personification in Jesus – wisdom, truth and light. St Paul in the Second Reading preaches a crucified Christ. This is an obstacle to some, but for Christ's followers, through his death and resurrection, he is the power and the wisdom of God.

In The Gospel, Jesus ejects the buyers and sellers from the Temple and in doing so reveals himself as the true Temple. Like the Temple, he too, will be destroyed in his body, but will rise again. As we journey with Jesus, may we find in him the true sanctuary, and perhaps the wisdom to know when to disturb the peace. We celebrate on the Third Sunday of Lent Jesus the giver of the Spirit, the Spirit that is a fountain of New Life welling up and bubbling over, giving us a New Heart and a New Spirit, overflowing with love to God, to each other in the Body of Christ, to our world in its pain and hope. May this Lent be a time of renewal for each of us and for the Church that we will grow more as the Sacrament of God's Universal Love.
