For over fifty five years the Church has celebrated this Sunday as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations and this is to remind us how earnestly we need to pray for vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life especially from our own community, our parish, and our own families. All of us have a role to play in fostering priestly vocations. How important that there always will be good holy priests and parishioners who will lead us to Christ and share with us his love, a love that not only consoles and strengthens us, but indeed a love that changes us, transforms us, into his disciples and witnesses. Jesus is the Good Shepherd; he comes to us in the Eucharist. May we open our hearts to him in love and thank him for loving us infinitely and personally. May we listen to his voice and follow this Good Shepherd wherever he leads us.

GOSPEL REFLECTION: This Sunday we hear the comparison that Jesus makes



between himself and the Good Shepherd. Jesus makes a distinction between the hired man who is unwilling to protect his sheep versus the Good Shepherd who is willing to lay down his life for his sheep. During this Easter season we must remember that we are called to be both the sheep and the shepherd. First, we are called to be the sheep in our relationship with Christ. The pandemic has given us an opportunity to listen and take life slower but we may soon

return to that noisy, fast paced world we once knew, so we must be sure that we know and can recognise the sound of our Shepherd's voice. We must also be the shepherd to our flock, the Church. We are called by Jesus to lay down our own plans so that the Holy Spirit can work through our lives. When we do this we can serve our brothers and sisters in the way God intends for us. We too are called to entrust our lives to the Good Shepherd – to entrust to him our cares and worries, to allow him to lead us back when we stray; and to allow him to teach us how to serve one another, just as He cares for us. In reflecting on this story we should ask ourselves the following questions: Do we truly hear the voice of our Christ, our Good Shepherd? And do we follow His example and lay down our lives for the sake of others? May we always seek Jesus Christ first in our lives in order to do his will.
