**GOSPEL REFLECTION:** In the first part of the Gospel reading (Mark 10:2-16), the Pharisees approach Jesus and test him by asking whether it is permissible under God's law for a married couple to divorce. Jesus quickly draws a distinction



between divorce as allowed by Moses and the permanency that God wills for marriage. Jesus clarifies that Moses permitted them to divorce because of their "hard hearts". In other words, they had closed their hearts to God's will. The people placed their own desires before what God had commanded. Jesus recalled that from the beginning, God intended that marriage be a permanent, lifelong union between a man and a woman.

Things are not all that different today. There continues to be a growing list of challenges to marriage. We all know someone, or we have ourselves experienced the pain of divorce in our families and among our friends. We are not called to judge, but to bring compassion and offer prayers of support for all those affected by the breakup of a family.

The reading continues with what seems to be a disconnected event. People begin bringing their children to Jesus in the hopes that he might bless them. As this is happening, we read that the disciples "rebuked them". He instructs the disciples to let the children come to him, and he goes on to say that "the kingdom of God belongs to such as these". Then Jesus gets to the heart of the matter. He says, "Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." We must place our trust in God that He will provide for our needs. And like little children, who know to turn to their parents for help, we must continually bring our worries, our concerns, and our problems, to our heavenly Father.
