We must always remember that our call is a privilege to serve God's people. That is, to proclaim the good news through words, and through our actions among His people. Hence, it is important to know that a missionary without commitment to the good news, prayer and the people of God, is simply a tourist. Therefore, with the psalmist, let us renew our commitment to God by proclaiming: "My lips will tell of your justice and of your help day by day. O God, you have taught me from my youth, and I will proclaim your wonders."
