GOSPEL REFLECTION:



The Fourth Sunday of Easter we traditionally celebrate as Good Shepherd Sunday and Vocations Sunday. This is because in the Gospel of the Day (from St. John's Gospel), Jesus speaks of himself as the Shepherd who is prepared to lay down his life for his sheep.

When a man becomes a priest, he sacrifices his own will and chooses instead to follow Jesus and he

aspires to become as Christ to others. In doing so, he answers Christ's call to serve the Church and its people.

In the Gospel we hear that the Good Shepherd owns his sheep and cares for them accordingly. This is a different prospect from the hired hand charged with taking care of the flock, since the hired man may run away to save his own life if the sheep are attacked, leaving them potentially scattered or injured. In contrast, the Good Shepherd puts his flock first rather than thinking of his own well-being, and will go the extra mile to find one of his lost or injured sheep.

Furthermore, St. John writes that the Good Shepherd knows his sheep, just as they know him: there is an indefinable and comforting bond of recognition. He speaks also of those sheep who do not belong to this fold, meaning those who do not know or have not yet come to Christ. Evangelisation is at the core of the Church's mission, so that we may all be 'one flock' with 'one Shepherd'. In following Jesus we are all able to give witness to the generous love of God, which is given willingly through the sacrifice of his Son, a sacrifice, which is perpetuated in the ministry of our bishops and ordained priests.

Following on from these meetings the diocese has now submitted its report to the Bishops Conference of England and Wales. CURIA ROADSHOW - DERBY DEANERY - Our Parish

Many Deaneries across the Diocese are facing changes and many Parishes including our own will look very different in the future. At present we are one of only a few parishes to have three priests and what the Synod does is to plan for the future - part of the diocese plans of the future is the reorganisation of Deaneries and this will mean joining parishes together to be served by one priest. We are part of the Derby plan in that St. George's will join with Alvaston parish and St Joseph's will join with Our Lady of Lourdes. Also in the meeting notes you will read the closing of Holy Spirit. These changes at present have no defined timelines as it will be dependent on the number of priests available in the future. Also, to address my retirement. I am part of a large number of ageing clergy and I will be celebrating my 81st birthday this year. My wish is to continue as a working priest as long as my health allows, but I review my plans each year, as do all priests of past retirement age. So at present I am in good health and will continue, with the Bishop's blessing, to serve you. I hope this will quell the unrest and I shall give a short talk at each Mass next weekend with an opportunity for you to ask any questions etc. We are a busy parish with good attendance, a very busy sacramental programme with wonderful parishioners here at St. George's and Holy Spirit.
