**GOSPEL REFLECTION:**

The story of a woman caught in the act of adultery in John 7:53-3:11 often carries the following exclusion clause, 'The earliest and most reliable manuscripts do not have John 7:53-11.' Nevertheless it forms part of the Canon of Scripture and is therefore the authoritative and inspired word of God. (2 Timothy 3:16). Scholars grapple with why it was absent from early manuscripts but perhaps it was deemed too scandalous, too shocking a display of God's mercy, perhaps there was concern that it could be misconstrued and misinterpreted.

The woman the Pharisees drag before Jesus is a victim of entrapment and malice. We all know that, like the tango, adultery takes two – but the man is conspicuous by his absence. In the Torah those found guilty of adultery were punishable with the death penalty (although it was rarely carried out). The manner of execution was not prescribed except in the case of a betrothed virgin (Deut. 22:23-24) and required the death of both parties, not just the woman (Lev. 20:10).

The entrapment was designed to back Jesus into a corner. If he agreed to her being stoned, he would find himself in conflict with the Romans: if he did not, he would not be condemned by the religious leaders for his moral laxity. Jesus' answer disarms and challenges. 'Let him who is without sin throw the first stone.' For even the best of us, the noblest and holiest, knows that just a cursory glance into our own hearts reveals that we are sinners, beggars before God. Jesus does not condemn, Jesus forgives, he does not judge. Next time you hear of a sexual scandal, either in the media or closer to home, don't condemn: offer up a prayer for everyone involved and ask for God's mercy and grace to be poured out. God's mercy is deeper than the ocean, wider than the sea, higher than the mountain and beyond comprehension.
