GOSPEL REFLECTION

In the Parable of the Vine and the Branches Jesus highlights our relationship with the Father. The branches have no life in themselves: they draw it from the main plant, and if they are cut off from the plant they wither and die. Jesus tells us plainly that 'apart from me you can do nothing' (v.5.). Our human pride does not like to hear this: we like to achieve things by our own efforts, and people often boast that they are not dependent on anyone else for their success. Being a Christian means abandoning this sort of attitude: it means accepting that we are fallen creatures who can do nothing to make ourselves right with God and humbly asking him for forgiveness.

The great paradox is that the more we humble ourselves and depend on the Lord, the more he can work in us and the stronger we become. As Paul memorably said, 'when I am weak then I am strong (2 Cor. 12:10). Jesus encourages us to abide in him, and then he will abide in us and we will produce much fruit.

What does it mean to abide in him? It means that we must spend time with him in prayer every day and become aware of his presence. Even if we can only pray for a short time, this will affect how we live during the day. We can learn to turn to him during the day, to depend on him and ask him for strength and guidance in our difficulties. If we do this, then we are sure to bear fruit for him, in good works and in being witnesses to others by what we do and say.

Lord Jesus, you are the source of our life and apart from you we can do nothing. Help us always to abide in you so that we may bear much fruit and the Father may be glorified in us.

The Power of Dependence

Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. John 15:5

I remember moments of my adolescence when I began to feel my independence from my parents. Starting high school, first job, driver's license – all were small steps that led eventually to the necessary separation from child and parent.
