GOSPEL REFLECTION: Many are troubled by Jesus' reaction to the woman in today's reading. Their concern is based on Jesus' initial reaction to the woman who's clearly desperate and seeking help. It's hard to understand why Jesus simply ignored her plea for help: '[He] did not answer a word' (v.23 NIV). Jesus' disciples ask Jesus to send her away. In a reply that seems totally unrelated, Jesus reveals the reason for his lack of response to the woman's need: 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel' (v.24). Jesus' primary mission was to gather all the faithful together into God's kingdom so that they would become a people covenanted to God and each other and so be a light to the nations (Isa.49:1-6).

What a shame that we don't know this courageous woman's name! She doesn't give up but cries out again. "Lord, help me!" (v.25). Jesus' response to her plea is hard for us to hear, but bear with us and light will be shed. He says, "It is not fair to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs" (v.26). In using the word 'dogs' Jesus is drawing on a popular stereotype used by Jews in contempt of Gentiles, but it could also be translate as a kinder term: 'pups'.

Jesus is continuing his mission to minister only to the Jewish nation. In her response, the woman reveals no resentment, just profound faith: 'Yes Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their master's table' (v.27). Identifying her 'great faith' immediately Jesus duly rewards her with her daughter's healing. This woman's witness of courageous perseverance and utter determination holds out hope to us all. We can too easily become despondent and lose faith if your prayers aren't answered immediately or we perceive that life is unfair. We must ask the Holy Spirit to keep increasing our measure of faith. As St John Henry Newman once said, 'I may love by halves, I may obey by halves; [but] I cannot believe by halves: either I have faith or I have it not.'

Lord grant me a faith, which is bold and confident of your love and mercy.
