GOSPEL REFLECTION: There are many important questions: what should I do with my life? What career path should I pursue? Should I marry or enter the religious life? What's the meaning of life? What happens after death? However, there's one question that's more important than every other, that sets the course of our life and needs to be answered daily: who do you say Jesus of Nazareth is? This was the question put to the disciples by Jesus and which Peter answered so decisively and clearly: the fruit, we learn, of the blessing and grace of the Holy Spirit (vv.13, 16-17)

Jesus was the child of a peasant woman. He was born in an obscure village and grew up in another village, where he worked as a carpenter until he was 30. Then for three years he became a wandering preacher. He never went to college, held office, had a family, led an army or even travelled 200 miles from his birthplace. He did none of the things that usually accompany greatness. He had no credentials but himself.

While still a young man, the tide of public opinion turned against him. His friends ran away. One of them denied him. Another turned traitor. He went through the mockery of a trial. He was nailed to a cross between two thieves. While he was dying, his executioners gambled for the only thing he owned on this earth – his clothing. When he was dead, he was laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend and rose again on the third day. Twenty centuries have come and gone, and today he's the central figure of the human race and the leader of the column of progress.

It's true when we say that even put all together, all the armies that ever marched, all the navies that ever sailed, all the parliaments that ever sat, and all the kings that ever reigned haven't affected the life of humanity as much as that one solitary life, the life of Jesus of Nazareth. Who do you say this man was?

You, O Lord, are the Christ, the Son of the living God, God-made-man, who humbled himself, even unto death on a cross, and rose again in victory on the third day as the Risen Lord.

Fr Jude, as we have reported, will be leaving to take up his new post in Syston with St Patrick's, Leicester, for the weekend of the 10th September 2023. His last Sunday Mass will be on 3th September at 9.30 am followed by a celebration gathering and presentation to which all are invited. Our Bishop Patrick, who makes his decisions after consultation with his Council of Priests and Vicars General and Parish Priests has moved Fr Jude and advised Canon Alan to reduce the Masses at St George's and Holy Spirit by one.
