## GOSPEL REFLECTION:

'We celebrate this day not because of the visible sun, but because of him who made this day.' (St Augustine).

Today is truly a day to celebrate. Many centuries ago, St Leo the Great, fearful almost that any would give way to sadness or grief on this most holy of days, said: 'Our Saviour, beloved people, is born today. Let us rejoice. It is unlawful to be sad today for this is the birth of life. This life brings happiness of a promised eternity to us since the fear of death has been destroyed. Let the holy exult because they are coming near to their prize. Let the sinners rejoice because they are invited to grace. Let pagans be encouraged because they too are summoned to life.

The Christian faith is often wrongly understood to be about what we do for God: our prayers, our works, our striving, our holiness. We can sometimes even think that we will be saved or get to heaven because of who we are or what we have done for God. If that were true, there would not be much cause for celebration, because what Christmas Day makes clear is that the Christian faith is all about what God has done for us. What has God done for us? God has become one of us to make us sharers and partakers in the divine nature. He has raised us up, he has reconciled us to the Father; he has opened up heaven again and restored what was lost through the tragedy of original sin and the fall of the human race. The wonder of God becoming man is that Jesus the eternal Word has ushered in a new and radiant vision of God's glory. In Jesus of Nazareth, God is made visible.

Today, the Holy Spirit will fill our hearts with joy as we recognise in Christ the revelation of the Father's love. Today, God is seen as one like us. Christ, the Son before all ages, is now born in time. He came to lift up all things to himself and to restore unity, leading us from exile on earth into our heavenly home. 'Today the Word who sits on the throne of glory with the Father became flesh, born of the Holy Virgin, giving the universe the grace and hope of adoption into the fullness of becoming children of God.' (St Ephraem)
