## **GOSPEL REFLECTION:**

Familial relationships are the deepest human relationships. The love we have for our parents, children and spouses is sacrosanct and profound. Everyone understands this, and this is why Jesus' teaching today can make us uncomfortable and uneasy: 'Anyone who loves their father or mother...son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me' (v.37). Indeed honouring our parents is so cherished and revered that it is the fourth of the Ten Commandments. Jesus came to fulfil the law not abolish it, so what can this mean? We need to dig more deeply and ask the Holy Spirit to enlighten us, to give us a grace of revelation. Our parents are God's wonderful gift to us, as we are to them, but they're not the ones who can 'put us right with God' (see Rom. 3:22). Jesus is the One who came to reconcile us with the Father. Our parents gave us life but only Jesus can give us eternal life. When Jesus stood before Pontius Pilate at his trial, he made it clear that his 'kingdom is not of this world' (John 18:36 NIV). This didn't mean that his kingdom was not in this world! It certainly is, but it's a kingdom the world hasn't known before.

What kind of king becomes king through the sacrifice of his own life? What kind of king takes upon himself the sin and guilt of all his subjects? And, indeed, what kind of king requires those who belong to his kingdom 'to take up their cross' to follow him (Matt. 16:24)? It was precisely by taking on himself our sin, and by sacrificing his life in loving obedience to the Father, that Jesus has truly put us 'right'. But we're 'put right' in the most radical of ways. Jesus makes of us 'a new creation' (2 Cor.5:17) In Jesus, the old creation completely passes away. The new creation is 'dead to sin and alive to God in Christ' (Rom. 6:11). But to become a new creation in Christ it's necessary to 'take up our cross': to let the old 'self' life be put to death in Jesus.

'Blessed are those who have learned to acclaim you, who walk in the light of your presence, Lord.' (Ps.89:15 NIV).
