GOSPEL REFLECTION: Parables were a common device in storytelling in the ancient world but Jesus' parables are unique. Great scholars throughout the world, whether believers or not, recognise in Jesus' parables the hand, work and mind of divine genius. When we contemplate the parables, especially the Parable of the Sower, we leave the world of human understanding and enter the mystery of God. Even the disciples didn't understand the meaning of this parable at first: they had to ask Jesus to explain it to them.

The Parable of the Sower teaches us that the Word of God, like seed sown in a ploughed field by a farmer, needs to take root in our hearts and minds. It's God who provides water and sunshine to make it grow. We, for our part, need to ensure that the soil of our lives is prepared to receive it. It needs to be tilled, and the stones and weeds must be removed. Without this essential preparation the seed won't be able to flourish: the roots that it produces won't be able to go down deep into our lives and the young seedling will be strangled and choked, and eventually uprooted. God's Word leads to this divine life. We hear this Word in Scripture or in prayer and it brings God's wisdom, light and life. For example, we might hear, 'Forgive your brother and sister. Let go of resentment, know you are forgiven' (see Eph.4:31-32; Luke 6:37). This Word spoken into our hearts is from God. If we hold on to this Word, protect it and cultivate it, we learn to forgive and let go of the anger, hurt or resentment. God speaks his Word to us in many and varied ways. Here is a Word from God for us today: 'Cherish and revere the parables Seek to understand the Parable of the Sower and its hidden depths. Ask the Holy Spirit for insight and for the grace of revelation.'

Lord God, by your grace may I produce fruit in my life by cultivating a heart which is open to receiving the gift of revelation and insight and so enter ever more deeply into the profound mystery of faith.

The Seed is the Word

Hear then the parable of the sowers. Matthew 13-18

In the agricultural environment where Jesus was raised, he often saw farmers casting seeds by hand to the left and right as they walked through the fields. That ancient practice of scattering the seed was the original meaning of our modern term broadcasting. That image became the basis for Jesus' famous parable to explain the Word of God. The seeds are Good News: words of wisdom, cast to the world to produce a harvest of love and peace.

I especially like this parable because I was raised on our family farm. I often remember my dad walking through the fields broadly casting alfalfa seeds as I helped clear away some stones. After Jesus had preached this parable, he explained it to his Apostles. The Word of God is pure, sacred and powerful. Our souls are the soil to keep clear of thorns, stones and briers. There, the Word can be planted to grow into a spiritually fulfilled life.
