GOSPEL REFLECTION: Have you ever been so frightened or overwhelmed that you accidentally say something that's complete rubbish? If you have, then you're in good company because this is just what happened to Peter. Mark makes it perfectly clear that Peter, James and John were scared out of their minds when Jesus transfigured before them, recording that, '(They) did not known what to say, for they were terrified' (Mark 9:6). Jesus' human body was suffused with such heavenly glory that the three onlookers became overwhelmed by the dazzling

What was happening? What is the meaning of the Transfiguration? How are we to interpret it? These are the kind of questions the Holy Spirit is always urging us to ask. Curiosity is the preserve and prerogative of those who are seeking to grow and mature in faith. What was happening was that the three chosen disciples were given a foretaste of the heavenly glory, both of Jesus and of those who belong to him. Peter's experience up the mountain was so profound and formative that it permeates his preaching. In his Second Letter he writes, 'For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honour and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying. "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We....heard this voice.... While we were with him on the holy mountain' (1:16-18).

In Jesus' Transfiguration we're invited to see an image of our humanity when it's completely suffused by the knowledge of God's love. As the Second Person of the Trinity Christ has always radiated with glory. But now, as man, Jesus shows how our humanity will also be glorified. As we, in faith, embrace Jesus as the manifestation of God's loving plan of salvation, a wonderful transformation takes "...Jesus...though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself...and became obedient to the point of death – even death on a cross.' (Phil. 2:5-8)

Psalm 32(33):4-5, 18-22

'May your love be upon us, O Lord, as we place all our hope in you.' Psalm 130 is called the De Profundis ('Out of the Depths'). It is a truly beautiful prayer flowing from the depths of the Psalmist's very being. To recite it is a grace, to put it to memory a blessing. 'Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord; O Lord, hear my voice. Let your ears be attentive to my cry for mercy. If you, O Lord, kept a record of sins, O Lord, who could stand? But with you there is forgiveness therefore you are feared' (Psalm 130:1-4). Jesus' teaching on forgiveness 'falls like rain, descends like dew, like showers on new grass, like rain on tender plants' (Deuteronomy 32:1-2). It refreshes, restores and renews. God has forgiven us; we in turn receive the grace to forgive others.

Lord, show me that in forgiving I am forgiven: in showing mercy I receive mercy and in loving I am loved in return.
