GOSPEL REFLECTION: Today's Gospel reading forms part of Jesus' Eschatological Discourse, which begins in Matthew 24 and goes on until the end of chapter 25. Earlier in his Discourse, Jesus emphasised that the Second Coming would be unmistakable (24:27-31), unknown (v36) and unexpected (v.44). His focus, however, wasn't the where or when of his return, but the response expected of faithful disciples. This emphasis is captured in the phrase 'Keep awake'. which occurs in Matthew 24:42 and is repeated in Matthew 25:13.

The in-between section comprises three parables (the thief and the house owner: the slave who remains faithful; and the wise and foolish bridesmaids) which stress both the unexpectedness of the master's return, and the absolute necessity for his servants to be prepared or to 'keep awake'. But what does 'keep awake' involve?

The focus in this parable isn't the uncertainty or unexpectedness of the master's return, but the conduct expected of his servants during this indeterminate absence. Readiness for Jesus' return isn't achieved by idle speculation about dates or times but in responsible stewardship of what's been entrusted to us and invested in us by God. It's about keeping the faith in difficult and trying circumstances, for the master will be gone a long time (v.19) and the date of his return is uncertain.

'Talents' here don't refer to gifts or abilities, but to a unit of money. The servants were to engage in trading in their master's name (v.16). To be identified with Jesus and to do business in his name is seldom profitable from a purely human viewpoint. It's also, frequently, a risky business! It's far safer not to get too involved, like the third slave who opted for safety. rather than service.

Yet 'keeping awake' is never about passive waiting, but demands an active involvement in anything and everything which is God's business. Our faith is expressed not only in Creeds and confessions, but by putting our money where our mouth is, that is, living as 'children of light and children of the day....' (1 Thess. 5:5).

With God as our Investment Advisor, the ride maybe rocky but the returns will be out of this world!
