GOSPEL REFLECTION:

The story of the encounter on the road to Emmaus is unique to Luke's Gospel. In fact, it contains the fullest post-resurrection account of Jesus' encounter with the disciples of all four Gospels. For Luke faith is a form of sight: seeing with fresh spiritual eyes (cf. Luke 9:45). This gift of new sight reaches its pinnacle when Jesus opens their eyes to understand the Scriptures which had spoken about him.

Bear in mind, of course, that these Scriptures were from the Old Testament. Luke writes: 'And their eyes were opened and they recognised him.... They said to each other, "Did not our hearts burn within us while he talked to us on the road, while he opened to us the scriptures?" (vv.31-32).

We are called, if you like, to be contemplatives: men and women who treasure and cherish the Word of God. For this is where God speaks to us in the most powerful way. Pope Gregory the Great said, 'The Bible is a letter from Almighty God to his creatures.' Therefore, if we want to find out the mind of God, we must read the Bible and become increasingly familiar with the sacred text. Think of it this way: just as the Holy Spirit made the disciples' hearts burn, so too he will make ours burn with the light and flames of God's love. Because reading the Bible without love is simply a chore.

The bishops of the Second Vatican Council had hearts that burned with love for God's Word, and out of that love they recorded these compelling words which are still deeply relevant to the Church today. 'The Church has always venerated the divine scriptures just as it venerates the Body of the Lord, since from the table both of the Word of God and of the Body of Christ it unceasingly receives and offers to the faithful the Bread of Life. It has always regarded the scriptures together with the sacred tradition as the supreme rule of faith, and will ever do so' (Dei verbum 21).

Lord, make my heart burn with the love of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Draw near, look and touch, Jesus says to each of us today. May we never hesitate, never fear to draw close to his loving compassionate heart.
