GOSPEL REFLECTION:

To understand the New Testament we look to the Old. Today, Mark alludes to the apocalyptic imagery of the prophet Daniel: 'In my vision at night I looked and there before me was one like a son of man, coming with the clouds of heaven' (Dan. 7:13). Jesus is this Son of Man, and a central truth of our faith is that he will come again. 'Faith in Christ has never looked merely backwards or merely upwards, but always also forwards to the hour of justice that the Lord repeatedly proclaimed. This looking ahead has given Christianity its importance for the present moment'. (*Spe salvi* 40).

The Spirit invites us to rediscover a fresh and new appreciation of this central teaching of our faith. We need, as it were, to uncover and seek out a grace of revelation, so that this essential doctrine can have an impact on our lives. That is not to say that we become fanatical or unduly anxious or focused in an unhealthy way on the Second Coming.

Rather, it means we seek to pray and reflect on the 'last things' in a way which expands our vision so that we look beyond the moment, indeed look beyond history. At the heart of the teaching of the Second Coming is the Lordship of Christ. Theologians of old used to speculate about how, if humankind had not fallen, whether Christ could indeed have been incarnate.

Without the fall and sin would we have needed a Saviour or simply a King, the Lord and Creator? Most of us wouldn't have time to ruminate on such ideas, since we live in a world of mortgage or rent payments, bills to pay, mouths to feed. It is precisely in this reality of daily life that we can live out our hope in the Second Coming. You see, whatever challenge, suffering or hardship we face in life, one day all of human life, all of human history, indeed the very cosmos will be wrapped up and come under the Lordship of Jesus Christ. Lord of heaven and earth, we long for your return, and ask for the grace to stay awake and keep watch, ushering in your glorious return as Christ, the Servant King, Our Lord and Saviour.

To Be Led Gradually

Jesus said...: "In those days after that tribulation the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light..." Mark 13:24

A couple of years ago, I lost all my rosemary bushes and a few azaleas in a freeze.

The problem was not the temperature itself, but the fact that it dropped so far so quickly: from the fifties to the teens over just a few hours. The plants couldn't live through the rapid, dramatic change.

This reminded me of one of the beauties of our liturgical tradition, evident in today's Scripture readings. It's not Advent yet, but it's coming, and here we are, being eased into it. (Not that a quick transition between seasons would literally kill us!) But to be led gradually, to be invited to slowly open our hearts and minds to those last things and our subsequent need for the Saviour, is more fruitful than a sudden plunge and, yet, more hospitable to – spiritual – life.

Loving God, guide me along this journey to you.
