GOSPEL REFLECTION:

Despite divorce being commonplace and often described as 'amicable', beyond the platitudes, divorce can only be brutal and painful. Why is this true? Because every divorced couple were once a married couple who publicly declared their love and made solemn vows to each other. The breakdown of every marriage is a tragedy, and those caught up in it deserve compassion and understanding.

Monogamy is God's plan for the human race. Two, a man and a woman, becoming 'one flesh' (Gen. 2:24) is integral to divine revelation. This was, however, an ideal which the ancient people of Israel failed to live up to, with the practice of polygamy widespread in the ancient world and testified by the Hebrew writers of the Old Testament. The Mosaic law, while containing provisions to protect women from arbitrary divorce, did permit divorce – a concession because of the hardness of men's hearts (v.5).

The tragedy and consequence of the Fall is that marriage has always been threatened by discord, a spirit of domination, infidelity, jealousy and conflicts that can and often do escalate into hatred, separation and divorce. Marriage is a divine institution: 'what God has joined together, let man not separate' (v.9 NIV). Marriage is God's plan, and the marriage bond a sign of

separate' (v.9 NIV). Marriage is God's plan, and the marriage bond a sign of God's covenant. Marriage is a gift of love, and by God's grace couples partake in restoring God's original order of creation in which men and women were intended to live together in unity and covenant.

Married couples then, have received a lofty and noble vocation. There is a very real way in which the entire Christian life bears the mark of the spousal love Christ has for the Church. Husbands are called to love their wives as Christ loved the Church and gave himself for her (Eph. 5:25-26).

'It is by following Christ, renouncing themselves, and taking up their crosses that spouses will be able to receive and live it with the help of Christ.' (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1615)

A Radical Vision

Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it. Mark 10:15

Jesus said and did many surprising, even revolutionary things, but this might be one of the most world-shaking. His call for us to be like children can, of course, prompt a great deal of fruitful meditation. Is it a call to be open, trusting curious?

To understand our dependence on the Father, to approach him aware of our need and with faith in his care for us?

All of this, yes! But even more, consider this historical nugget: Jesus was speaking to a world – not his Jewish world, certainly, but the broader pagan world – in which children were absolutely disposable and exploitable. To hold up a child – a *child!* - as a model of the spiritual life was unheard of . Absurd, even.

What words of Jesus have the power to challenge and shake my worldview, if I really listen?

Jesus, may I be open to your radical vision.
