#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION:**

The ability to talk about the profound questions of life seems increasingly difficult. Nowadays such questions are considered 'too deep' or 'too heavy', and there is an unspoken convention that politics and religion are best avoided in polite circles. This is to our detriment; the ancient world did not suffer from such reticence, as we witness in today's Gospel.

The rich young man is clearly focused on eternal life and the things that matter and how to obtain it (v.17). Little did he know that he is talking to the very One who can give it. The rich young man's fascinating discourse with Jesus reveals that he had committed himself to keeping the Ten Commandments, at least externally. He is rather like the Pharisee (a good man, no doubt) who brings to God in prayer his good deeds and thanks God that he has not sinned against the commandment to steal or commit adultery (Luke 18:18:11). His departure from this encounter is one of the most moving and poignant moments in the New Testament.

He faced up to his inability to relinquish his possessions, which prevented him from knowing the solace and promise of eternal life. How salient the words of Thomas a Kempis: 'For a small reward a man will hurry away on a long journey; while for eternal life many will hardly take a single step.' The story of the rich young man illustrates that the moral life, while noble and worthy, falls far short of the life of grace. Although rigorous in keeping the

Although rigorous in keeping the demands of the law he lacked the insight to understand that his heart was not right with God and only Jesus could set him free. Jesus is the One who gives eternal life, and he came to redeem and save not the righteous but sinners. Our goal is to 'take hold of the eternal life to which you were called when you made the good profession in the presence of many witnesses' (1 Tim 6:12). 'For this is the will of my Father, that every one who sees the Son and believes in him should have eternal life: and I will raise him up at the last day' (John 6:40)
