GOSPEL REFLECTION: The disciples were slow, sluggish even to grasp the meaning and importance of Jesus' cross. To be fair, there is an air of mystery in the way the Lord refers to it, but he does prefix his word with the caution: 'Listen carefully to what I am about to tell you: The Son of Man is going to be betrayed into the hands of men' (v.44 NIV). Luke says that Jesus' meaning was 'hidden from them'. Furthermore, fear kept them from going any further – they were terrified to probe more deeply, ask questions and discover the meaning of Jesus' words.

We can be like this too. The meaning of the cross is hidden and obscured through our own lack of curiosity or enquiry. In short, we aren't hungry enough!!

The cross stands at the very heart of Jesus' mission. The cross also stands at the very centre of human history because Jesus' sacrifice reveals the profound depth of God's love and mercy. It is as if we asked God how much he loved us and Jesus spread out his hands on the cross and said, 'This much,' the cross reveals both the depth of human misery and the depth of divine love. In order to take up our own cross we need first to understand the meaning of Jesus' cross. The theologian Jean Baptiste Lacordaire OP wrote: 'A God on the cross. That is all my theology.' Many centuries before, Paul proclaimed that he resolved to know nothing except Christ crucified and clearly expressed his heartfelt desire that 'God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ' (Gal. 6:14 KJV)

To him, the cross was a mystery into which he had been immersed through the grace of conversion and the sacrament of baptism. If we are to plumb the depth of God's mercy, touch his love, feel his compassion, and know his kindness and infinite beauty, we can only enter this blessing through asking God for wisdom to enter the mystery of the cross.

'The world is full of mysteries: heaven is all mystery to us earthly creatures. But whoever embraces the cross with open heart finds there the explanation of all mysteries.' (Archbishop William Ullathorne OSB)
