GOSPEL REFLECTION:

Under Jewish law a woman was required, after giving birth, to offer to the Lord in sacrifice a lamb, or if she could not afford it, two turtledoves or two young pigeons (Lev. 12:6-8).

Mary and Joseph, in bringing Jesus to the temple, fulfilled the legal requirement. At the same time they also consecrated Jesus to God (Exod. 13:12). In presenting Jesus, Mary and Joseph were returning to the Lord, with thanksgiving, the very gift that he had given them. Their offering expressed the depth of their devotion and love of God.

The Spirit rested on Simeon, preparing his heart for the Lord's coming and causing him to long to set his eyes on the Christ of the Lord (vv. 25-26). Delighting in Jesus, he declared: 'Mine eyes have seen thy salvation... a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to thy people Israel' (vv.30,32). Similarly Anna was seeking the Lord. She had been in the temple for years, longing and praying for the Lord's coming. Now, drawn by the Spirit, who had placed this longing in her heart, she blessed Jesus, the delight of her heart (vv. 36-38).

In Mary, Joseph, Simeon and Anna we see so much desire, longing and love for the Lord. They rejoice as they recognise that Jesus was the longed-for Christ. Their desire, longing, recognition and delight was the work of the Holy Spirit in their lives. The spirit wants to give us a similar longing – no longer, of course, for the first coming of the Lord, but for his return. The Spirit wishes to purify our hearts from all dullness, indifference and apathy so that we may desire to see the light of Jesus' face and long to set our eyes on his glory. This longing for and delight in Jesus is a blessing and through it the Holy Spirit consoles and comforts us. (v.25).

Holy Spirit, purify my heart from all cares, anxieties and deadness. Delight my spirit by showing me the loveliness and goodness of Jesus. Make my heart long to see Jesus return in glory
