GOSPEL REFLECTION:

We are familiar with the Sermon on the Mount, which Luke calls the Sermon on the Plain, but we may not be as familiar with the Sermon from the Boat!

We don't know what Jesus taught on this occasion, but when he had finished he gave the fishermen instructions to cast their nets despite having been being out all night and catching nothing.

How dispiriting and exhausting this must have been! Peter was reluctant. However, he obeyed against his better judgement, for he clearly thought they didn't stand a chance of catching even one fish! How wrong he was – for the catch was overwhelming, overflowing even and almost sank the boat!

Clearly Peter was staggered, shocked and humbled and he cries: 'Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord.' Jesus doesn't let Peter or the other disciples, who are clearly beyond astonished, wallow too much because they have work to do – from now on they will be catching something else. In short, their task is to be joy-filled evangelisers, missionary disciples.

Historically, we tend to think of the work of evangelising as the preserve of 'professional religious' (the clergy, religious or lay people employed in this capacity). It is not true, for we are all called to be missionary disciples and win others for Christ. Surely it is only right to share the joy of the gospel.

Saint Pope John Paul II vividly described this. 'The eyes of faith behold a wonderful scene: that of a countless number of lay people, both women and men, busy at work in their daily life and activity, oftentimes far from view and quite unacclaimed by the world, unknown to the world's great personages but nonetheless looked upon in love by the Father, untiring labourers who work in the Lord's vineyard. Confident and steadfast through the power of God's grace, these are the humble yet great builders of the Kingdom of God in history.' (*Christifideles laici*. Para 17).

Lord, give me the courage to put out into the deep, be a joy-filled evangeliser and live my life in a missionary key.
