GOSPEL REFLECTION:

Today we celebrate the feast day of the Body and Blood of Christ. The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. This phrase 'source and summit' is a rather awesome one, isn't it? It is as if in the blessed Eucharist is contained the entire spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Passover Lamb. St Irenaeus put it so beautifully when he said many centuries ago. 'Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking.' What does it mean to have our way of thinking attuned to the Eucharist?

One way is to read the Feeding of the Five Thousand as pointing to the Eucharist – the Bread of Heaven. The word 'Eucharist' has its roots in the Greek word *eucharistein* which recalls the Jewish blessing prayer – especially during a meal – giving thanks for God's work of creation, redemption and sanctification. At the very heart, then of the Eucharist is giving thanks to God. The Eucharist is a celebration of praise and thanksgiving at which Christ is made real and present. This is why, on entering a church where the Eucharist is in the tabernacle, we recognise the presence of Christ by genuflecting.

We must cultivate a genuine sense of Eucharistic wonder and awe. This will happen as we allow the Holy Spirit to help us grow in awareness of the fact that it is truly Christ himself whom we are receiving.

This understanding that Christ is real and present in the Eucharist cannot be grasped by the senses but only by faith, and our faith relies on God's authority, for it was Jesus himself who said: 'This is my body which is given to you.' St Cyril of Jerusalem said, 'Do not doubt whether this is true but rather receive the words of the Saviour in faith, for since he is the truth, he cannot lie.' The Eucharist is our greatest gift; it is our richest blessing and most cherished treasure. Nothing in the Christian life compares to it, for in the Eucharist is Christ himself, the 'Godhead here in hiding'.

'Godhead here in hiding, whom I do adore, masked by these bare shadows, shape and nothing more. See, Lord, at thy service low lies here a heart lost, all in wonder at the God thou art.'

REFLECTION FOR THE SACRED HEART FEAST

The heart has been understood by many cultures to be the very centre and essence of a person. We speak of people having a 'big heart' or having a 'heart' for a project or event; those humbled through grief or a fractured relationship are described as having their 'hearts broken'.

Today we celebrate the feast of Jesus' Sacred Heart, the focus of which is always God's burning love for humankind. This feast day has its roots in the visions of St Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-90), which shed new light on Christ's divine love for every person.

To know God's love is vital if we are to grow and mature as Christians. A sure and firm grasp of God's love enables us to live out the Christian life with joy and confidence. The best and most effective way to enter into the mystery of God's love is in and through the cross.

It is in reflecting and pondering on the cross, the Paschal Mystery that the Holy Spirit can show us how great is God's love. Paul was compelled by love because he knew it was love which compelled Jesus to die on the cross for us.

We need to move beyond sentiment and come to a true understanding of the reality of God's love because we often misunderstand it. We too easily succumb to the kind of thinking which believes that we must earn God's love but, of course, we cannot. The Father loves us because we are created by him and redeemed by Jesus, his beloved Son. The amazing, wonderful and totally magnificent aspect of God's love is that he loves everyone, no matter who they are. The essence of God's love is that God first loved us. He is the Good Shepherd, who leaves the ninety-nine to seek and save the lost sheep. The sacred heart of Jesus is a heart burning with divine love for every lost soul.

'You will find all that is lacking in your heart in the heart of Jesus, dying on the cross. Then you will be enabled to love those whom you would naturally, in your pride, hate and crush.' (Bishop Francis Fenelon)
