GOSPEL REFLECTION: The Highway Code is a book of signs. We study it diligently but less so once we have our licence. We often assume we know more of the Highway Code than we do and are surprised by changes and updates.

We know how to read the Highway Code but don't always know how to read the Signs of the End of Age. Both point to God's final and definitive intervention in human history in the Second Coming, the Return of the King. Jesus warned of wars, revolution, earthquake, famine, plague upheaval and uncertainty. As if this wasn't enough tumult and tribulation Jesus also stressed a time of trial and persecution. The apocalyptic language of the Gospels and the New Testament can be unnerving and unfamiliar. And yet the Catechism of the Catholic Church echoes it: 'Before Christ's second coming the Church must pass through a final trial that will shake the faith of many believers.' (CCC675).

What are we to do? How are we to think and act? Do we run for the hills or stand firm in faith? Are we crushed with fear and anxiety? As hard as it is to hear, Jesus counselled that we make a decision not to succumb to worry, 'Make up your mind not to worry' (Luke 21:14), and promised the gift of wisdom. 'For I will give you words and wisdom that none of your adversaries will be able to resist or contradict' (Luke 21:15). Jesus invites us to stand firm in faith. This invitation is echoed throughout the New Testament. 'Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong.' (1 Corinthians 16:13) and 'Resist him, standing firm in your faith' (1 Peter 5:9). Do not be afraid. Jesus has redeemed us and he is with us even unto the end of time.

May God grant that I speak with judgement and have thought worthy of what I have received, for he is the guide even of wisdom and the corrector of the wise?' (Wisd. 7:15)
