GOSPEL REFLECTION:

The Parable of the Weeds is unique to Matthew's Gospel. Its theme addresses the thorny issue of God's judgement and our propensity to play judge. God knows the Church is made up of saints and sinners, the good and the bad, those who live exemplary lives and those who do not. The Church is a motley crew, that is for sure. However, that is its beauty, its wonder and its glory. Jesus died for us all and God the Father loves all his children – obedient and disobedient, those on the road to sanctity and those far from it.

We, however, are less forgiving and less compassionate, and so the parable is addressed to us and our tendency to become self-righteous and judgemental. One of the perversities of British culture is the tabloid press. Of course, most western countries have a tabloid press, but the one in Britain is especially virulent and vicious. Quite why this is the case, given the British reputation for fair play and decency, is hard to understand. Interestingly, and not a little confusingly, the head of the tabloid industry is Rupert Murdoch. He is not a Catholic but was a Knight of St Gregory. The tabloid strategy is to titillate and tease, on the one hand, and then judge and condemn, on the other. Rarely do we feel sorry for the public figure exposed as a hypocrite for a sexual misadventure or scandal – be it a politician, celebrity or indeed leading prelate, priest or churchman. However, have you ever thought about how God thinks about such things?

The Parable of the Weeds sheds light on this, because at the heart of the parable's message is: leave all judgement to God and refrain from judging others harshly, because you can never know what is in their hearts and what they are going through. God is merciful and kind to everyone, and we 'put on Christ' when we understand that there but for God's grace go we and judgement remains with God alone.

Heavenly Father, create in me a new heart which is less prone to judge others and more ready to hold out the hand of mercy, kindness and forgiveness to all those who have fallen or are in trouble.
