GOSPEL REFLECTION: What's the point in prayer? Do you ever feel like giving up? Is anyone listening? Is anyone there? Only people who pray ask such questions. Prayer is really important. How do we know this? Jesus taught a lot about prayer.

The German poet and philosopher Goethe never prayed because he argued that the world was set on its course anyway. Of course, God knows what we are going to ask in advance. But the *Cathechism of the Catholic Church* teaches that God 'is the Lord of the universe, whose order he established and which remains wholly subject to him and at his disposal. He is master of history, governing hearts and events in keeping with his will....' (CCC 269).

God did not create the world and then leave it to its own devices! He has assured us through the Scriptures that God intervenes and prayer changes things, for God's sake prayer can move mountains. We must keep praying, as Paul says, 'at all times', that is when things are good and when things are bad. Of course, prayer can be frustrating. Sometimes our prayers never seem to be answered. But God may be leading us to the virtue of perseverance, in Greek hupomone, which we translate as 'stickability'. Christian faith teaches us the virtue of fidelity even in difficult times. We also have help from others in our prayer. Our reading from Exodus tells the beautiful story of Moses being helped to pray by Aaron and Hur holding up his arms (see Exod. 17:12-14). The Church has a particular role in encouraging our prayers, by giving us the right prayers to say, and by giving us pastors and Christian friends who can help us and guide us as we grow in 'stickability'. Don't give up!

'To thee, O Lord, I call; my rock, be not deaf to me....Hear the voice of my supplication, as I cry to thee for help, as I lift up my hands toward they most holy sanctuary.' (Ps. 28:1-2)

PARISH RENOVATION WORK: The old wall at the front of the carpart and church is being replaced by a new brick wall which will extend to the front of the church.
